# MISSION

The Agency's mission is to facilitate, regulate and enforce a smooth flow of traffic in a manner that optimises mobility and accessibility, to foster public and private partnerships, thus contributing to the seamless integration of the Southern African Development Community through:

- Road Transport Agreements with Southern African Development Community Member-states, based on extra-territorial jurisdiction.
- Strong public and private participatory forums.
- Effective and visible law enforcement.

# THE AGENCY



- Cross-Border Road Transport Agency was established in 1998.
- To provide for co-operative and co-ordinated provision of advice, regulation, facilitation and law enforcement



# THE BOARD

The Agency is governed and represented by its Board, which the Minister, after consulting with the relevant stakeholders, appoints and delegates all powers to run the Agency:

# CORE FUNCTIONS



## Regulatory:

Enable/monitor regulated flow of freight and passengers in the region, through the issue of permits.

## Law Enforcement:

Visible and physically enforce compliance to the Act by both operators and drivers.

# CORE FUNCTIONS (CNTD)



## Facilitation:

- Improve unimpeded flow of freight and passengers in the region
- Reduce operational constraints for the cross-border transport industry as a whole
- Enhance and strengthen the capacity of the public sector in support of its strategic planning, enabling and monitoring functions.

# CROSS BORDER CONTROL



- C-BRTA regulates movement to and from the neighbouring states.
- C-BRTA have no jurisdiction over local and inter-provincial routes.
- C-BRTA regulates vehicles that carry 9 or more passengers.
- C-BRTA regulates vehicles with a GVM of 3500kg and above.

# THE PERMIT



- Allows operators to transport goods or passengers to neighbouring states.
- Pick up from one point in RSA, drop off at one point in the destination country.
- Pick up only at designated areas as per permit.
- One permit per vehicle per route.
